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## Chinooks Anti-Doping Policy

Chinooks Soccer Association fully adheres to and supports the Canada Soccer Association's commitment to the Canadian Center for Ethics in Sport, Canadian Anti-Doping Program. The Canadian Anti-Doping program is designed to protect athletes' rights and ensure a level playing field.

Participants are required to avoid prohibited substances and methods of doping and should practice the following precautions:

Check all medications and products before taking them to ensure they do not contain ingredients that are banned in sport.

Verify your medical exemption requirements.

Learn about the doping risks associated with supplement use and how to minimize them

Parents, coaches, and other persons of authority at Chinooks are required to familiarize themselves with the Canadian Anti-Doping Program and can do so by educating themselves via resources CCES at [www.cces.ca](http://www.cces.ca).

## Anti-Doping Education

Applicable for U13 age group and above.

Chinooks coaches are required to hold informative discussions with their respective teams preceding each season. For education purposes, an interactive learning environment will be offered to players to gain knowledge of best practices to stay clear of doping substances.

Player's attendance is mandatory, with absentees required to coordinate education time with coach or club staff prior to competition. Team manager, to document and submit attendance lists to Chinooks' administrative staff.
